Understanding the plot...and the Main character.

Just a month ago we lit our Paschal/Easter candle that stands prominently near the altar area. The Exsultet, the Easter vigil song of glory proclaimed: "Rejoice, O earth, in shining splendor, radiant in the brightness of your King! Christ has conquered! Glory fills you! Darkness vanishes forever!". This simple phrase captures both the identity of Christ and of ourselves as a redeemed people. But, just hearing these words is not enough, we have to identify with them.

Have you ever tuned into a T.V. or radio program that was already in progress? It may have taken some time before you figured out what the plot was or who the characters were. It's only when you can establish a "story line" or, who the person or persons are, that things begin to make sense. Once that happens you can have a clearer understanding of the conversations taking place and who is speaking them. This whole process is colored by what you have figured out and what you understand. Having a well known actor or knowing the name of the show can make a big difference.

Our Easter story has a well known title and its key figure, Jesus, is obviously well known to us. We accept that Jesus is the savior and that we are his followers and that our salvation is the purpose of the story. Knowing this allows us to both know who He is and who we are in relation to Him. When we figure this out then we can't see Him for anything less than being our Savior. In the same way when we acknowledge being a member of his flock, we can't turn back and pretend that we don't belong to Him.

While his closest followers still were trying to completely understand who He was, we surely are not in that state of confusion. They partially doubted, that He was the Messiah, while we accept Him as such. He didn't look like anyone special...we know the opposite is true. But like them we still want, or need, signs of reassurance. The great gift of faith is to believe in things unseen and to accept what He has shown and shared with us. We have the seven sacraments...all signs of His presence and care for us. We have the Sacred Scriptures, living words to guide us. We participate in a community that visibly acknowledges that we are called to follow Him together as we are. Pope Francis referring to today's first reading (Acts 6:1-7) says that there are conflicts in life, the question is how we confront them. He tells us to look at the apostles and see how they resolved any conflicts"...they faced one another and by praying with the certainty that gossip, envy, and jealousy can never bring us to concord, harmony or peace". We need to be grounded in that Easter-Vigil proclamation

"Rejoice in shining splendor,
Christ has conquered.
Glory, fills you.
Darkness vanishes forever."

We no longer have to spend time figuring out who He is, or what his message is all about...just believe and live it in faith.

Items for your Consideration & Awareness

1. We are currently experiencing some major difficulties with the **Air Conditioning** unit on the Kokohead side of the church. Until we can get three bids, and decide upon a suitable replacement, we ask for your patience. The short term solution is to weekly re-charge the system...and the longer term resolution will be to replace that unit. We will get this done as quickly as possible.

2-**Traffic Advisory:** the 5th Annual Honolulu Ekiden Relay Run will be taking place on Sunday, May 21st..the Makai lane of Kalaniana'ole Hwy will be coned beginning at 4:30 am. Traffic can cross the coned lane to exit using caution. HPD officers will be placed at major intersections.

3-**R.C.I.A.** We are currently looking for any adults who wish to join the Catholic Church and receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Communion (any or all three). Please either call the Rectory (396-0551) or see Fr. Mike after any Mass.

The committee reviewed our Lenten Journey and decided to continue these activities once again in the coming year.



Diocesan Baccalaureate Mass with Bishop Larry Silva


