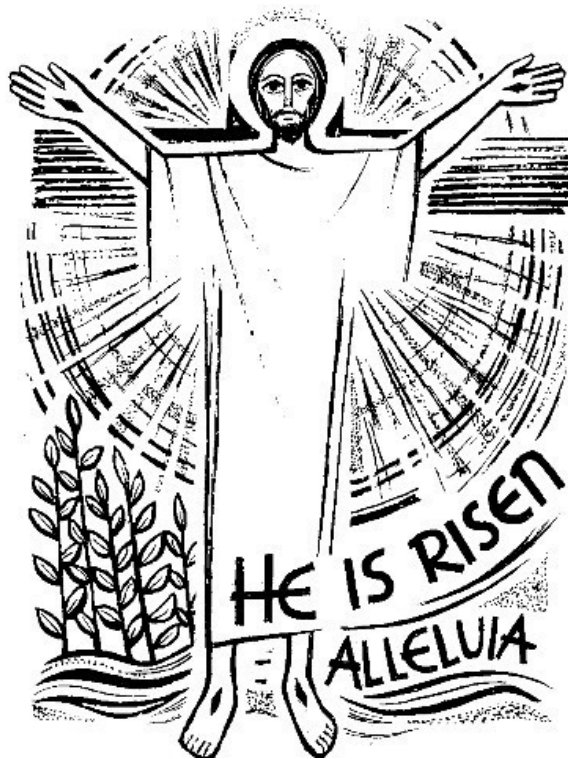

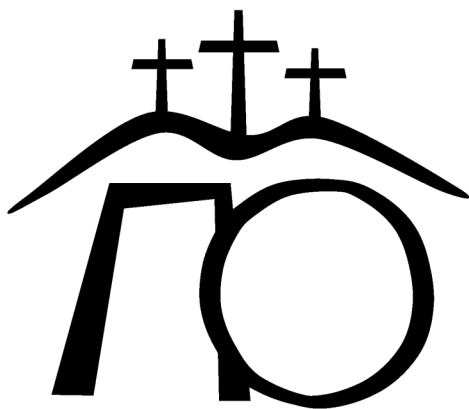

After the Resurrection...Now what?

With Holy Week and now Easter complete where does the church want us to focus our spiritual attention? These post-Easter weeks carry us forward to yet another wonderful Feast, Pentecost. Although 50 days away, we are to enjoy the many times that Jesus returned and appeared to His followers. The challenge is to be able to carry the joyfulness, of Easter's Alleluia's, throughout the upcoming Pentecost season. Liturgist, Nathan Mitchell offers some suggestions about how to achieve such a worthy goal.

“Fifty days of ‘dwelling in’ the paschal mystery! Fifty days of surrendering in joyful faith and love as the Spirit of God takes possession of our lives! Fifty days of mystagogy (to understand the great Easter mystery), of walking with the neophytes (Kay, our newly baptized) ever more deeply into the baptismal mysteries of death and resurrection. Good heaven! What an order! It is a time of intensified consciousness, finely attuned awareness, awakened memory. In short, Pentecost is a season for learning how to say yes in a culture that wants to keep on saying no.” (Mitchell: The Blessed Pentecost)

In short, we are to stay fully aware of God's continued presence in our faith-lives. As with any celebration, birthdays, anniversaries, an engagement, getting promoted or graduated...we should hold on to the excitement of those occasions...don't let them fade! This indeed is the season of the Lord, it's our time to bask in the radiance of the empty tomb and the resurrection of the Lord. In today's language we would say, ‘party on’... Jesus would say, ‘absolutely!’

Executive Summary-Pastoral Council Meeting, March 12, 2018)

(In Attendance: Vickie Barela, Dane Olaso, Sue-Ann Moniz, Fr. Mike, Butch Correa)

On March 12, The Pastoral Council met to further discuss where the Parish stands in terms of its goals that it has met, where we are, and where we want to go. The four main pillars that our Parish should strive for are Faith Formation, Leadership Development, Strengthening Marriage & Family Life, and Youth & Young Adult Ministry have all been addressed and making continual progress. The main question now is how to improve moving forward.

Father Mike reminded us of the many opportunities and groups, some 40+ different ministries, for people to volunteer and utilize their time and skills for the community and the needy. The council touched upon a lack of community outside of Sunday Mass, and the habits that Catholics tend to have. An example is the favorite seat and knowing the 7-12 people who happen to sit near them every week. A suggestion was made to have more social events that draw people as a Catholic community to fellowship and get to know each other – more so specifically as a social gathering rather than a ministry to serve the needs of others. Catholic Spaghetti Dinners was an idea shared during the council, a time to spend time with others of similar values would provide another avenue to bring us a Parish together outside of Sunday Mass. The goal is to improve the warm and welcoming Holy Trinity spirit that we share to those around us a little further, not only to visitors but to each other as a parish.

The second main topic that arose was a trend that occurs after confirmation. There is a lack of continuing our journey in the pursuit of knowing and following our Lord Jesus Christ. There is a need to continue to refine not only our spirit but our minds and knowledge of our faith, not only for ourselves, but when someone questions our faith we can respond appropriately. The journey doesn't end confirmation but continues onward the rest of our lives. How to incorporate more teachings in limited amounts of time on Sundays is a challenge, so a suggestion was a brief question or lesson be placed within the bulletin or the slides before and after mass for parishioners to see.

The last main topic that was briefly touched upon was that there is a need to know who our parishioners are and what are their needs and concerns that need to be heard or shared. Although not in detail or depth, it was made apparent that the most effective form of question and feedback is the quick paper questionnaires and census that are distributed during Mass. As to what would be on the questionnaire, there would be a need to identify not only those who are attending Mass weekly, but those who have fallen away or are lost. There is a need to know where they are for us as a Parish community to not only pray for, but invite, welcome and serve.

There are many ways to move and improve, but it all begins with a small step, trial and error.

We can't become who we need to be if we remain the same person we are today.
